Coins for Alzheimer's Research Trust (CART)
 Alzheimer's Disease is claiming more and more victims worldwide every day. Over 4 million Americans are now victims and medical scientists predict that unless a prevention/cure is found that the number of American victims will grow to 16 million within the next 20- to 25 years. Further, that without a cure, one out of every 10 living Americans will ultimately become victims. It is estimated that 75 percent of the world's victims live outside of the United States.

Beginning in 1995, Rotarians in South Carolina, Georgia and North Carolina contribute small amounts weekly to fund research that can bring an end to this terrible disease.

The CART Fund was developed with the idea of accomplishing its goals without conducting fundraisers and without interfering with other projects of our various clubs. In order to do this, we developed the concept of asking Rotarians to voluntarily empty their pockets of change or whatever amount they wanted to donate when they attend our weekly meetings. It is estimated that on any given day in America, \$8.25 billion in loose change passes among our citizens. This provides a very simple, painless and effective way to raise much needed funds for Alzheimer's research.

Fred will serve as Milledgeville Rotary Club president beginning July 1. He and his wife Tomi have been living in Milledgeville since our retirement from the U.S. Army in the summer of 1995. His Army career spanned 33 enlisted and commissioned years. He served in peace and war (Viet Nam 1966-1968) and retired as an Army Colonel of Field Artillery. He is the Georgia Military College Executive Vice President and is responsible for overseeing the day-to-day operations of the college. Before becoming the Executive Vice President, he was the GMC Commandant of Cadets, Dean of Students, Director of Character Education, and Professor of Ethics. He has been a Rotarian since May 1999 and was an honorary Rotarian in the El Paso, Texas club from 1990—1995. Fred has been a member of our local club's Board of Directors the last four years during which time he served as chairman of various Club Service and Community Service Committees and most recently 2004-2005 President-Elect.
