PowerPoint presentations on Rotary history now available

As preparations are made for the 2004-05 Rotary Centennial year, Rotarians have a new audiovisual tool to help celebrate Rotary's history, available exclusively through www.rotary.org.

Rotary International has launched the first of 12 historical presentations designed especially for Rotary's centennial celebration. The first presentation, "RI Presidents Through the Ages," features historical photos that highlight the themes and contributions of Rotary leadership. A new PowerPoint presentation will be added each month to the Rotary Centennial site, through June 2005. Downloadable PDF versions of the presentations will also be available for each presentation.

Future topics will include growth and extension of Rotary throughout its first century, Rotary's work with youth, Rotary and peace, and The Rotary Foundation. The presentations can serve as short club programs to inform members of different aspects of Rotary history and keep the Rotary Centennial in the spotlight throughout the year. Members can also use them as short courses on Rotary history.
