Rotarian project will enhance charm of Perry

Many residents of Perry, GA know the 69-member Rotary Club of Perry for its annual bass fishing tournament that raises funds for several local charities and initiatives.

But quietly, through a hands-on community service effort, the club is adding a recreational landmark to the charm of the city of 10,000.

Now in its second year, the Big Indian Creek Project is aimed at building a 5-mile nature trail through Perry. When completed, the trail will link the Big Indian Creek Bridge and the city's downtown with the Georgia National Fairgrounds and Agricenter on the outskirts of Perry.

"This is by far our biggest community service project," explains Billy Jerles, a past president of the Perry Rotary club and a city council member. "It is an ongoing effort. We don't have a completion date, because we are doing [the work] in stages."

Rotary club members recruit volunteers and schedule dates throughout the year for clearing garbage, stones, and bushes along the planned trail.

In addition to providing physical labor and donating hand tools, the Rotarians contribute funds to help rent some of the heavy equipment used to move earth, brush, and debris.

Their most recent work days, falling on consecutive weekends, attracted scores of people, including Mayor James Worrall, State Senator Ross Tolleson, and the city's most famous son, retired U.S. Senator Sam Nunn and his daughter, Michelle.

Held on 30 September, the second phase of the cleanup coincided with the statewide Hands-On-Georgia initiative, which synchronizes 152 community projects in the state's 159 counties.

"I think it's one of the most exciting community projects that we've had happen in Perry in a long time," Worrall told the Macon Telegraph. "My hope is that we'll broaden [it] to include more than just the Rotary club . . . and really make it a true community-wide project."

Jerles explains that when completed, the project will include community parks, an amphitheater-type meeting place for children, pedestrian bridges, and tree-lined walkways.
