Washington, D.C., monument honoring Paul Harris and others is dedicated

A national monument honoring 20 leaders of major volunteer movements in the United States, including Rotary founder Paul P. Harris, was unveiled in Washington, D.C., on October 14th.

Former President George Bush led the dedication ceremony for the Extra Mile-Points of Light Volunteer Pathway, a series of markers set along a milelong stretch of sidewalks near the White House and the U.S. Treasury Department.

"The Extra Mile will not only educate but inspire all those who walk its path," Bush said. "[I]t should signal that greatness and goodness are not relegated to history books or confined to the existing monuments."

Cokie Roberts, a political commentator, and Anthony Williams, the city's mayor, assisted at the event, which was attended by more than 500 people. Eunice Kennedy Shriver and Millard and Linda Fuller, founders of the Special Olympics and Habitat for Humanity and the only living Extra Mile honorees, spoke at the ceremony.

The monument is marked by hand-sculpted bronze medallions embedded in granite and set into the sidewalk. Each medallion measures 42 inches in diameter and bears a bas-relief image of the honoree, a description of the volunteer's achievements, and a quotation.

The Points of Light Foundation, which heads up the Extra Mile initiative, estimates that each year more than 1.7 million visitors to Washington, D.C., will see the pathway.

The monument required both Congressional and District of Columbia approvals and is made possible through major support from the KPMG Foundation and other sources of private funding.

Other Extra Mile honorees include Clara Barton, Cesar Chavez, Frederick Douglass, and Martin Luther King Jr., as well as the founders of Goodwill Industries, Lions Clubs International, and Volunteers of America. Medallions for 11 more honorees are planned. The monument can accommodate up to 70 honorees.
